Chair's Report

It is a pleasure to provide my Chair's report for Kangaroo Island Business and Brand Alliance for 2022.

It remains an honour to work with the KIBBA Board and with our Executive Officer, Lizzie Trethewey together with Jeanette Holden from our office.

The past 12 months has seen a number of changes extending from our own KIBBA staff to elections bringing with them Labor victories at both a state and federal level. This period also saw the reopening of the Australian economy and our state border to welcome back international visitors, as with a rolling back of COVID-19 pandemic regulations.

In April we farewelled Shauna Black who finished in her role with KIBBA as our inaugural Executive Officer. For those of you whom may not know, Shauna was appointed as the EO for Kangaroo Island Brand Alliance before its amalgamation with Business Kangaroo Island to form KIBBA, supporting our member businesses on the Island for more than six years. Since the formation of KIBBA Shauna was responsible for supporting membership growth from 150 members (at amalgamation) to exceed 200 members last year, of which more than 50% remain brand partner members. Shauna supported our members (and the Island economy) through thick and thin and remains a true champion of the Authentic KI brand and our Island's unique value proposition. We were able to host Shauna for a small farewell event prior to her departure. We wish Shauna all the very best in her move off Island!

April also saw the appointment of our new Executive Officer, Lizzie Trethewey, who commenced in the role from 20 April. Lizzie grew up on the Island and completed her secondary and tertiary education in Adelaide. She then worked in senior positions for the Victorian Employers' Chamber of Commerce and Industry (VECCI), Australia Post and the former Deputy Premier's Office. Lizzie brings with her extensive experience in media, key stakeholder relations, communications and brand strategy as well as deep insight into government at all levels. We remain honoured to have Lizzie leading our KIBBA team.

Following the March state election Labor confirmed its pre-election pledge to reinstate the Outer Areas Registration Concession for vehicles on Kangaroo Island. Following the cancellation of the concession, KIBBA remained active in advocating to all levels of government to call for its reinstatement with this being identified as a priority within our SA Election Charter 2022 document.

Labor's vehicle registration pledge covers most vehicles, motorcycles or trailers that are usually kept and used wholly or mainly in outer areas. The benefit provides for a 50% reduction in registration fees for vehicles with a gross vehicle mass less than or equal to 4500 kg and a 40% reduction in registration fees for vehicles with a gross vehicle mass over 4500 kg. The commencement of this concession will achieve hundreds of dollars of savings for all Islanders just on their own motor vehicles, together with tens of thousands of dollars for some of our larger member businesses and is a fantastic result.



Our Board, together with Lizzie and our administration officer Jeanette Holden, continue to work tirelessly to advocate in support of our members in delivering initiatives and projects to help their industries at large.

The past year builds upon the success KIBBA has achieved in our short history:

- retaining annual membership total of 204 members, of which an increasing proportion are Brand Partners (now totalling 107);
- commencing delivery of our \$300k
 Collaborative Industry Recovery and
 Resilience Project (CIRRP) in partnership with
 AgKI and KITA;
- ongoing distribution of the updated version of the KI community directory free of charge to our members and residents of Kangaroo Island;
- updating our online digital directory for Kangaroo Island at kangarooisland.org.au;
- ongoing advocacy to all levels of government in relation to the importance of sustainable industry for KI in keeping with the Island's unique value proposition;
- strengthening our relationship with government and key stakeholder organisations within Adelaide and across South Australia;
- writing letters of support for our members' projects designed to grow local employment and investment on Island;
- retention/utilisation of KI Business Hub including moving our head office there; and
- further strengthening lines of communication (and connectivity) with Kangaroo Island Council, Department for Industry, Innovation and Science, and Business SA.

We have remained focused on growing our project portfolio and in advocating for housing development to support the Island's workforce. This is evidenced through KIBBA's recent attendance at the Kangaroo Island Housing Roundtable which was convened by Hon Leon Bignell MP and attended by Hon Nick Champion MP and Hon Nat Cook MP together with departmental heads and a select group of key Island stakeholders. KIBBA will continue to work with government and key decision makers to improve the wicked problem of housing on Island.

The upcoming year remains set to be a very busy period for KIBBA with closeout of our CIRRP project and the upcoming local government election. We will remain an active partner regarding the future arrangements for the Department for Industry, Innovation & Science's KI Business Hub, as with our support for opportunities to add value to our members and indeed to Island businesses overall.

KIBBA's financial results and reserves remain solid and underpin our ability to deliver projects and support for our members. Our staff and Board will continue to work hard to connect with (and listen to) our members.

As with last year's report, I do not have enough words to acknowledge the amazing work and efforts that my fellow Board members have made over the past 12 months and want to extend my heartfelt thanks and gratitude to each of you.

I would like to recognise the significant contributions of Peter Davis to the Board since our inception (as a founding Board Member) as he transitions into retirement, as with outgoing board members Blair Wickham and Lee-Anne Helyar.



I would also like to recognise Jenny Stanton whose recent appointment to our Board strengthens our understanding of the agricultural sector. Her insights will be highly valued.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge our valued members. Without your support we would be nothing.



Being based in the Business Hub makes a lot of sense, with the building a literal 'hub' with the space used for meetings, training and workshops our members and other businesses can access.
